Course Description and Requirements:

Prerequisite: Successful completion of Sophomore English. This course is designed to provide students with speaking skills and practice through a variety of speaking opportunities. Students will perform a variety of speeches designed for different audiences, focussing on voice, audience interest, body language, persuasion, and a variety of speaking techniques. Students will also enhance their vocabulary development using literature, standardized test practice, and composition. Vocabulary study will emphasize root words and prefixes to further student knowledge of a wide variety of vocabulary.

Core Text/Materials:

The Joy of Vocabulary, Levine *Vocabulary for the College Bound Student*, Levine
An independent novel may also be required.

Requirements:

Come to class prepared to learn! This includes having all of your supplies **and** a positive attitude. Supplies include the textbook, paper, pen or pencil, binder, journal, and your planner. Coming to class unprepared will result in a loss of participation points.

Classroom Management/Attendance:

The policies stated in the WHS Student Handbook will be followed. Attendance is a key factor in successfully completing this class. 200 participation points are given each semester. You are responsible for obtaining and completing any missed work. In addition, several activities involve classroom attendance and points for these activities **cannot be made up**. Tardies will not be tolerated. Tardies result in the loss of 10 points. Note: It will be possible to receive a negative grade in this area. **In addition, please see the attached policy regarding attendance and tardies at Wenatchee High School.**

Assessment /Evaluation:

Grading will be on a point system. Points will be awarded for homework, daily activities, participation, tests, writing assignments and speeches. Grades can be determined by adding up the the point totals and dividing it by the number possible.

In addition, all speeches must be completed and passed with at least a 60% (D) in order to pass Vocabulary and Speech.

Each section of class will be weighted into the class average overall. The weighted areas are as follows:

Tests and Quizzes:	20%	Writings/Projects:	20%	Participation	10%
Major Speeches:	30%	Daily Work:	10%	Final Exam	10%

Late Work Policy:

All homework is due at the beginning of class. Homework turned in late will be will NOT be accepted. The only exceptions to this rule involve excused absences. If a student has a prearranged absence, he/she must complete and turn in the work before leaving. You have one week to make up missed work and tests. All make-up tests can be completed before school on Tuesdays or after school on Thursdays in Room 254 or at Evening Study on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. **No other times will be scheduled.**

Extra credit will be available from time to time throughout the semester. However, extra credit will not be factored into your grade until the end of the semester, and you must earn at least a C (70%) in the class in order to be eligible.

Class Rules:

1. **Respect:** Respect is the basis for a successful experience this year. That includes respect for me, your classmates, the classroom, and yourself.
2. **Preparation:** Always come prepared to learn. Be in your assigned seat when class begins and have all of your materials with you. Class time is short And we want to make the most of it!
3. **No Cheating!:** Cheating in any form will result in an automatic zero for the assignment or test, disciplinary action, loss of participation points, and no opportunity to make up the missing points. This rule applies to both those who are doing the copying **and** those who are allowing it to happen.
4. **Participate:** Join in class discussions and participate in group activities.
5. **Have Fun:** Not everything we learn will be exciting, but you can make the learning process fun. You really do control your own attitude.
