Seniors will be making their Culminating Project presentations. To verify the date, time and location of your child's presentation, follow the directions below:

- 1) From the WHS web site, <http://whs.wsd.wednet.edu> click on **Omni Help Desk**
- 2) Scroll down until you see **News and Announcements** in the lower left hand corner. Just below this, click the link for "**Culminating Project/Senior Presentation Schedule.**"
- 3) In the upper right hand corner, click on the calendar icon second from the right. This pulls up a monthly calendar page.
- 4) Scroll down to see the names and times of all students presenting on each day. Click once on the name and a note with the room location and CP advisor will appear in the upper left hand corner of your screen.

Scroll to the bottom of the screen for a complete listing of presentations in chronological order.

All juniors are expected to attend at least one senior culminating project presentation during WASL/ITED testing weeks, and will have opportunities to explore various Career Center offerings listed below:

Scholarship Savvy - 4/19: 9:00-9:45 and 4/25: 8:15 - 9:00 (Lab 9:00-9:45)

Gives students a jump start on a critical part of finding \$\$ for after high school education, by showing them the ins and outs of "scholarshipping."

Helps students explore their future through the online WOIS (Washington Occupational Information System).
