Attendance is Essential

The attainment of academic excellence requires attendance on a regular basis. Student accountability for regular attendance has an important value in the educational process. Every class at WHS provides a learning opportunity. Please review the attendance policy in the student handbook (pages 7-8), and become familiar with the expectations of both you and your student. Calling in your absence can save students and the school a great amount of time. Absences can be reported by calling **663-6903**.

School Dress Code



WHS Student Dress code states, "Appearance and attire at school should be neat, clean and within the bounds of decency, health and safety. Dress and appearance shall not be disruptive of the educational process of learning objectives." Please refer to the expectations outlined in the student handbook on page 12.

In addition, the following items that have been associated with gang involvement are NOT acceptable at WHS.

- Any "**Dallas Cowboys**" clothing or accessories of any kind. That's anything with a "**5-pointed star**", "**Emmit Smith**" or "**E. Smith**" or the number "**22**" on it.
- Any "**Oakland/Los Angeles Raiders**" clothing or accessories of any kind.
- Any "**Playerz 69**" clothing or accessories.
- Any "**Playboy**" or "**Playgirls**" clothing or accessories.
- Anything with the numbers "**13**" or "**14**" in any style of font or graphics on it.
- "**OLD ENGLISH text**"
- And finally, anything with a weapon or drug/drug paraphernalia on it.

Student Parking



Those students driving motor vehicles to Wenatchee High School will be required to adhere to the following:

1. Students will be required to register their vehicles. Registration forms will be available on September 1 (picture day) and during the school year from the campus security office.
2. If a parking sticker is provided, it should be displayed in the lower front corner of the windshield on the driver's side.
3. Parking will be first come first served until parking spots are full.
4. Students may not park in spaces that are marked **visitors, handicapped** or in the **staff lot**. **Do not park on curbs painted red or yellow**. Violations will result in fines, tickets, vehicle locks, or the vehicle possibly being towed.

All student parking will be FRONT LOT only. The back (south) parking lot is for staff parking only and not for student parking or **student drop-off/pickup**. Those doors (south) are locked at all times and students are to enter the building only through the north doors or the bus ramp doors if they ride the bus.

Messages for Students • Check-Out Procedure Deliveries for Students

Due to the impact on student learning, our offices will no longer be delivering messages throughout the school day. Student messages will only be accepted from the student's parent/guardian for **emergency situations only**. Messages will NOT be delivered to classrooms, unless approved by the principal or designee. Personal arrangements for transportation, appointments, etc. should be made prior to school time.

Parents needing to release their student during the school day, **should send a note in advance or come to the attendance office to complete check-out procedures.**

Flower and balloon deliveries for students will not be accepted at WHS. Personal items such as lunches, books, backpacks, etc. brought for students during the day by a parent/guardian will be held at the front desk. The student's name will be put on the reader board and the student will be expected to come to the office to pick up the items. Deliveries of personal items will NOT be made to classrooms.

P.E. Uniforms



A P.E. uniform and heart rate monitor strap will be required for all physical education students at WHS and are available to purchase through the ASB office. The new uniforms this year are \$12 and consist of black mesh shorts and a gray T-shirt. The old uniforms (gray shorts and shirt) are \$6 and will be available until sold out. The heart rate monitor strap is \$4. It is recommended that these items be purchased on Thursday, September 1st, picture day.

The uniforms come in sizes from S-XXXL. Both shorts and shirts have a spot for the student's name to be written in permanent ink. Students may use the old uniforms for as long as they desire. Any questions may be directed to P.E. Department Chair, Maureen Rix.



Your ASB Card . . . Don't be Involved Without it!

You are encouraged to purchase an ASB card for \$25 at the beginning of the year. Not only is your card official identification, but it will get you into all home Panther sporting events for **FREE**. You will get discounts on all dance admissions and discounts on the purchase of your yearbook if purchased in the fall.

If you are planning on participating in any sport, club or activity this year you **MUST** purchase an ASB card. All money raised from the sale of ASB cards is allocated to activities and athletics to help support those groups.

Finally, the class that purchases the highest percentage of ASB cards get big points towards class of the year.



Student Planners - \$4 Required

All WHS students are required to purchase a student planner for the 2005-06 school year at a cost of \$4. The planner is a useful organizational tool for students and has a number of functions: 1) It contains school policies; 2) It provides planning calendars for student personal and classroom use; 3) It contains dates of important school activities; and 4) it serves as a student's hall pass. Be sure to pay for your planner when taking care of your other school fees at the ASB office.

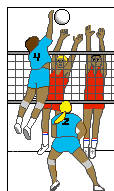

Many Important Yearbook Deadlines Approach Soon

Senior Pictures: Seniors who would like to be pictured in the senior section of the 2006 WaWa yearbook should make arrangements to have a senior photo taken as soon as possible. Photos are the responsibility of the senior and are due to the yearbook staff in Room 262 by **Oct. 5**. Inclusion cannot be guaranteed after that date.

Requirements for inclusion are a glossy, color, wallet sized print. Ideally, the student's head should measure 1.25 inches from forehead to chin to look his or her best.

Congratulations Ads: The yearbook staff sells congratulations ads to parents, families and friends of seniors. Many choose to include a baby picture and good luck message. Forms will be mailed to parents around Thanksgiving. Photos are returned at the end of the school year.

Yearbook Purchase: Students interested in purchasing a yearbook should do so early in the school year to guarantee availability. All available copies were sold last year, and some students were disappointed. **Buy yours early and save money too.** The cost for a 2006 WaWa yearbook is \$40 with ASB card until October 31. The price is \$44 without an ASB card, or if purchased after October 31. The price goes up to \$48 if purchased after May 1st.

The staff recommends name plates for \$5. This is an attractive way to ensure that your book is not mistaken for another's. Name plates are available only on books purchased by Jan. 15.

The yearbook staff encourages you to buy your yearbook early and save your receipt!

Directed Study

Students, it is critical that you get your picture taken in order to receive your schedule. You must present your picture ID to receive your schedule. If you do not get your picture and schedule on September 1, a temporary I.D. and schedule will need to be picked up the first day of class (Sept. 6).

Freshmen will get their pictures taken and receive their class schedule at IGNITE! 2005 on August 29th. Freshmen who are unable to attend on August 29th should plan on following the schedule above on September 1st.

To ease the impact on sports practices, I am asking coaches to have the team members come for pictures prior to practice. You can move through very quickly and should plan on arriving a half hour before your practice time.

For urgent situations, please come between 7:30-8:30 a.m. or 4:00-4:30 p.m. for your picture. Otherwise, follow the planned schedule. This will keep us moving at a smooth pace all day. Remember, this picture will serve as your ID picture, as well as your yearbook picture. You can also purchase a variety of packages so come prepared "looking good".

Schedule Corrections

The Wenatchee High School Counseling staff works extremely hard to insure that all of our students receive the classes that they requested, in addition to their required classes. Even so, some errors do occur. If you have an error in your schedule that is due to one of the reasons listed below, counselors will correct your schedule:

1. A missing period or a double scheduled period.
2. A required course was not scheduled.
3. You were incorrectly placed in a course for which you do not have the appropriate skill level or do not have the prerequisite class.
4. You have already taken and passed the class in which you are scheduled.
5. You failed a class in the past and received the same teacher for the same class on your new schedule.
6. You need to adjust your schedule because of Running Start or Skills Center conflicts.

Counselors will correct schedules for all grade levels in the LGI on September 1st and 2nd from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon and 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. Once classes start, corrections will be made in the LGI by grade level:

Sept. 6 Seniors Only
 Sept. 7 Juniors Only
 Sept. 8 Sophomores and Freshmen

Please note: for consistency in our process and to assure that all students are treated equally, schedule corrections will not be made for teacher preference, period preference, or lunch preference. If you have a question about your schedule, please contact the counseling office at 665-7618.

What is AVID?

Between remedial programs for struggling students and gifted programs for highly successful students, lie the silent majority: average students who do "okay" in regular classrooms. Many desire more challenging coursework but fear failure. Others do not even dare to dream of college because they don't have the resources or support at home.

This fall, Wenatchee High School and Orchard Middle School will begin implementing a program called AVID for students like this. AVID stands for Achievement Via Individual Determination. It is aimed at students in the academic middle who have the potential to succeed in college but may need additional support to achieve that dream.

Students are selected for the program based on the following criteria:

- 2.0 to 3.5 GPA and mid range test scores
- desire and determination to attend college
- first one in the family to attend college
- member of an ethnic group that is historically underserved in 4 year colleges
- low income

Once students are selected, they are placed in an AVID elective class with a teacher who has been trained in specific strategies that will help them succeed in a rigorous, college-prep curriculum. Trained tutors assist with collaborative groups and inquiry based approaches to learning. There is a strong emphasis on reading and writing strategies and organizational skills.

The program was founded 25 years ago by a high school English teacher in San Diego. It has a strong research base and a long track record of success. Today there are 100,000 students in 1900 schools located in 30 states and 15 countries. More than 70% of AVID students enroll in four-year colleges or universities compared to the national average of 25%. This is impressive considering that AVID recruits students who are not traditionally destined for college.

This program was made possible by pooling resources from the AP Incentive Grant and the GEAR UP Grant. Two teams of teachers from Orchard Middle School and Wenatchee High School attended an intensive, one-week training this summer to prepare for its implementation. One AVID class will be offered during this initial year at the 9th grade composed of students from Orchard Middle School who were part of the grant project. A 7th and 8th grade elective will be offered at Orchard. Stay tuned for more information about this exciting program or visit www.avidonline.org.

Internet Information

Students at Wenatchee High School have the opportunity to use the **Internet** to learn concepts, research subjects and share information. With this educational opportunity comes responsibility.

The Wenatchee School District has established "acceptable use guidelines" (District Policy 2314). In order for students to use the internet at school they must have parental approval and agree to use the network only for purposes that are educationally and ethically sound.

Internet consent forms will be made available to students and must be signed by the student's parent/guardian. Forms will be kept on file for the duration of the student's enrollment at WHS. All freshmen and new students must complete this form in order to gain access. Student in grades 10-12 who have been attending WHS and already have a form on file will not need to complete a new one.



Reminders From the Nurses Office

All health information required before September 6th

As you prepare to return to school this fall please be sure to update us with any **health concerns or conditions** you have that may affect you while in school. We also need to have a medication form signed by your health care provider for any medication you may be taking in school. You can obtain forms from the school nurse, attendance or counseling office.

If you will be new to Wenatchee High School you need to be current with all your immunizations required by Washington State law before you register for classes. Check with your health care provider regarding your immunization status or the Chelan/Douglas Health District at 886-6400.

Washington State immunization law requires all teenagers to have a tetanus/diphtheria booster by their 17th birthday. Tetanus/diphtheria boosters should be repeated every 10 years. If you are injured, seek medical advice about getting a booster even sooner.

Many colleges require that immunizations be updated before entrance into their school. This requirement is specifically for a second MMR vaccination (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) if you haven't previously received it.

Dear Parent, Guardian and Student:

As of July 24, 2005, schools are required to provide meningococcal information beginning with sixth grade entry to students and parents in our community.

Meningococcal disease, commonly known as meningococcal meningitis, strikes up to 3,000 adolescents and adults in the U.S. each year. Adolescents and young adults have an increased rate of contracting meningococcal disease compared to the general population, accounting for nearly 30 percent of all U.S. cases annually. According to one study, as many as one out of every four adolescents infected with the disease may die. Of those who survive, up to 20 percent suffer long-term disabilities, including brain damage, hearing loss, kidney disease and limb amputations.

The Department of Health wants you to be aware of meningococcal meningitis and the availability of a vaccine to protect against the disease. Vaccination can help protect against up to 83 percent of the meningococcal disease cases occurring among adolescents and young adults. **Vaccination is not required for school attendance.**

We encourage you to learn more about meningococcal meningitis and prevention and speak to your child's physician about immunization. In addition, we urge you to speak to your children about good hygiene and not sharing personal items that may help transmit the disease.
