Everyone wants to look good in the yearbook, right? Of course! In order to have more consistent face sizes in the senior portrait section of the yearbook, and to ease the layout and cost burden on the staff, here are specifications that will help everyone look his or her best in full-color in the 2005 WaWa yearbook:

1 Give us a 9x11-pica print

Although the photo prints may be trimmed slightly, submitting a **full-color, glossy** print (or digital image) that is close to the final reproduction size increases the chance of having the photo appear the way you and the photographer want it to look.

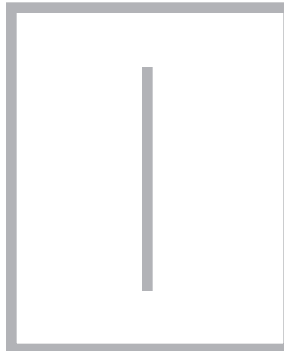
2 Make sure we can see your face

Not too big and not too small is a good rule to follow. **Each face should be 1 to 1 1/4"** from the top of the forehead to the bottom of the chin. The print will be trimmed a bit. Poses other than head and shoulders are acceptable, but keep in mind that it is sometimes difficult to identify faces smaller than 1" tall.

3 Allow plenty of time

Yes, we know things can get crazy at the last minute. Plan ahead so that the yearbook staff receives the print **BEFORE Oct. 6, 2004**. Know the deadlines and make arrangements for the photographer to deliver the print or digital image. **Only photos received by this deadline will be guaranteed a spot in the senior section.**

We now accept digital images, too!

The best way to guarantee each student will look his or her greatest is by using a high-quality digital image. Several photo studios have submitted digital images for two years, and the results have been outstanding. Here are a few requirements and suggestions:

- Save the image at **high resolution**. That means at least 300 ppi. Many digital cameras have the capability to be high resolution but need to be set.
- Size the image to 9 picas wide by 11 picas tall. If it is another size, the yearbook staff will crop it, and it may not be what you want. It's better to have the image too large than too small.
- Once you have determined the balance of color, save the image in CMYK mode. Computer monitors display in RGB mode, and that will not print correctly in the yearbook.
- Save as a TIFF or a JPEG file to a CD or ZIP disk. We can also accept images by e-mail.

If you have any questions about digital images, please call or e-mail. This can help us make each senior look the best!

What just won't work...

We want to be able to see each senior's face clearly. We cannot accept images...

- containing props such as firearms or pets
- displaying inappropriate emblems or slogans
- where the senior's face is obscured by clothing or other items
- images that are blurry or low-resolution
- images that are of poor quality, including Polaroid-type prints or sloppy scans

We can arrange a quality photo if necessary!
